Clayton Le Moors Harriers hosted this years event on the occasion of the seventy fifth anniversary. The event itself was held on Pendle Hill not far from Burnley , Lancashire. This year, the club sent three teams of six to what is one of the biggest events in the British hill running calendar. We were rewarded for travelling this distance with a glorious weekend of autumn sunshine . The relay consists of four legs each of which follows a different route and are of varying lengths. Two of the legs have to be run in pairs , hence the need for six runners.

The Cosmics A team were our star performers. Rob Taylor got them off to a solid start , but then Dave Armitage and Steve Rivers were unfortunate to follow an off route runner and the team fell back a little . it seemed at this stage that there was no chance of a top twenty place which at the outset had appeared to be a reasonable ambition. But the best was yet to come ! Greg Barbour and Tim Griffin clawed back ten places to post the fourth fastest time of the day on the third leg. Dan Whitehead , Cosmics uphill running

They were in with a shout of a medal until a navigational error on the third leg cost them dearly . Tracey ran the fastest leg of the day on the last leg , just to show what might have been . any disappointment was short lived however , and everybody is looking forward to next year's event which is going to be held in the Lake District.

The Devil's Burden Relay which is held on the Lomond Hills every February is an event organised along exactly the same lines as the British event. So if you fancy a go at this sort of thing let your team captain know about it .

Full minutes of the AGM are being produced by Shona - here are the highlights.
