## SAF, the HRC and SHR

From the last Bullsheet you will be aware (especially those on the e-mail circulation list) of the battle between the "anarchist hill billies" and the Scottish Athletics Federation over their demand that race organisers excluded non-SAF registered club members from SAF permitted races. Given that over half of Cosmics are not individually registered with SAF as a race organiser I faced the possibility of losing over half my field (and lots of friends) if I had enforced their 'silly' rules.

At a historic SAF extraordinary meeting at the end of January the 'anarchists' became the democrats when we were joined by the majority of road running clubs and several track and field clubs (including Aberdeen AAC) in voting through new rules. This to the astonishment of the SAF hierarchy who doubted whether we could even muster enough votes to call the extraordinary general meeting.

Both the Hill Running Commission and the Club Committee now urge you to consider joining the SAF Individual Membership Scheme - indeed if you run more than five SAF permitted races in a year then it is in your own interests to do so as non-SAF registered athletes will be charged £2 extra for every race. This does not include the Krunces (which are non-permitted) and this year's Clachnaben (which has an FRA permit) but will include Scolty, Tap O'Noth, Cairn William, Bennachie, Elrick Relays etc. and most road races.

## What is the Hill Running Commission (HRC)?

The HRC is the body with (limited) delegated powers from the SAF Board of Management for the organisation of hill-running in Scotland. There are also Commissions for Track&Field and Road&Cross-Country. I am a member of the HRC in my capacity of Championship Convenor.

## So what is the Scottish Hill Runner (SHR) group?

The SHR evolved from the now defunct Scottish Hill Running Association. The SHRA sought control of hill-running in Scotland from SAF's predecessor. With the advent of the HRC most of the rational for the existence of the SHRA died but SHR still retains the functions of publishing a newsletter (3/4 times a year) and the annual fixture list. To enable it to do this it has a separate subscription of £6 a year - details recently circulated by Steve Pryor. I was elected on to SHR at its last AGM.

## So what is the Fell Runners Association (FRA)?

The FRA is essentially an English equivalent of the SHR and likewise publishes a newsletter (well actually a rather posh magazine three times a year) and an annual fixture list (which includes some but not all Scottish races). Membership costs £9 a year and many Scots consider it value for money despite its English bias and incomplete Scottish coverage.

So which should I join?

Cosmic membership is the best value, followed by SAF Registration (if only to save on unattached levies). The FRA Magazine is superior to the SHR Newsletter but the SHR Fixture List gives far more complete coverage of Scottish races. It's up to you!

From your Sharjah correspondent, Rob Hickling

This year was the eighth annual running of the Wadi Bih Relay. This event is the brain-child of John Gregory, locally well-known British expatriate who lives in Ras al Khaimah, one of the smaller northern emirates about 90 minutes drive north-east of Dubai.

Running is not a particularly popular sport in the United Arab Emirates, and is restricted almost entirely to the expat community. There are the Hash House Harriers in the main cities, the Abu Dhabi and Dubai marathons and a handful of other races each winter season.

No-one in their right mind would run very far in the summer, even at night. In July/August the daytime temperature is about 42-44 degC and it only cools down to about 38 degC at 10pm and about 33 degC by 6am. Summer humidity is high by the Gulf coast, where surface sea-water temperatures get well into the 40's. People at my scuba diving club tell me that they've recorded 38 degC in the Gulf when diving at a depth of 60 feet. (Blood heat is 36.9). You get de-hydrated by just swimming.

The Wadi Bih is a dramatic wadi gorge, which runs east from Ras al Khaimah into the mountains of the Mussandam peninsula (which is actually part of Oman). They form a range of hills running north-south, alongside the Indian ocean coast. A 4WD track runs into the mountains, then climbs steeply up zig-zags to about 1,000 metres. Up on the plateau there are stunning views of the jagged mountains; these have virtually no vegetation and the geology is perfectly exposed. The track then drops equally steeply down into another wadi, which cuts through another magnificent gorge and emerges out to the coast at Dibba.

The relay is for teams of up to five runners, and each team must contain either a woman or a super-vet. The total length of 72km is broken up into 26 legs, varying from 1.1km to 5km. You can allocate legs how you like, provided that each runner runs at least 12km, and the first and last legs must be run by all the team together.

I ran the relay in 1999, soon after I arrived in the UAE from Scotland. I ran for Andy Jackson's team and we completed in a time of 6 hrs 6 mins (13<sup>th</sup> out of 40 teams). This year I ran for Andy's team again but we had a team of four, not five, because Andy and Chris were in training for the Comrades Marathon in South Africa later this year. But in the end they ran the shortest distances and I ran 9 legs and 23km ... so I reckon I was just conned.

We started at 7.20am. It was cooler than last year, and there was even some morning cloud on the hills which helped quite a lot. Later on it warmed up to about 25 degC and there was a strong headwind coming into Dibba. I went well to start with but felt tired by the time I had to run leg 23 into the wind. We finished in 6 hrs 8 mins, which wasn't bad considering we were a team of four.

There were 52 teams this year – so the attraction of the race is growing. Winning time was 4 hrs 28 mins by Abu Dhabi Striders – who have won the race all eight years of its existence. I reckon if a top Cosmics team were to enter next year, they would definitely have a good chance of winning. There's a great BBQ and free beer at the end.

## ----World Rogaine Results

Barbour and Rowlands Win the Men, Smith and Maturana the Womens Class

Although held in mostly open farmland, mist blanketed the higher parts of the course for the 4th World Rogaining Championships in Canterbury, New Zealand last weekend. This resulted in some very challenging navigation even during the daylight, although the existence of fences on the map made other parts of the course easier. The steepness of the terrain reduced route choice somewhat and led to many teams selecting similar "chains" of controls, but the organisers, Peninsula and Plains Orienteers, produced a fine event for the 400 competitors. \*

After coming second at the last World Champs in Canada, Greg Barbour and David Rowlands won the Open Mens title. Barbour is a New Zealander living in Scotland, while Rowlands is an Australian, who was planner of the first World Rogaine Champs in 1994. With a score of 2410 out of 3000, they were comfortably ahead of Chris Forne (NZ) and Nick Barriball (GBR), who amazingly met only the day before the event! In third place were Jason Markham (NZ) Dieter Wolf of Switzerland. Wolf was the 1999 World Masters Orienteering Champion in M50, and has an extensive orienteering and mountain marathon background, although he had never taken part in a rogaine before.

And the Open Womens Champions in Canada were beaten into second place by Rachel Smith (NZ) and Encarna Maturana (Spain) who is Barbour's wife. Catherine Hagen and Pam James (both from Canada) were the second placegetters, while Australians Jenny Casanova and Alexandra Tyson were third. The Open Mixed class was won by Jenni Adams and Rob Hart from New Zealand, ahead of Mark Saunders and Alice Bedwell (Wales) and Phil and Antonia Wood (New Zealand).
