### **MINUTES**

Colin set out the meeting by saying the following:

# 2. Approval of minutes of last AGM (5th December 2017):

### 3. Secretary's report:

### **Club Affiliation**

At the start of the year there was much debate about the club affiliation. After a very thorough process (thanks to Louise Provan in particular), a vote was held and the following email was sent out documenting the results:

The email went out to a 75 people, including those who had joined in 2017 or 2018. I have received 52 replies, with the breakdown of responses as follows:

- 44 votes to remain SAL affiliated
- 4 votes to leave SAL
- 4 people abstaining

The above numbers haven't been independently checked (either to check I haven't made them up or that I've not made a mistake), so if anyone would like to audit them I'm happy to forward on all the emails :-) I am however pleased with the 'turnout' and the clarity of the response.

The above also includes a small number who have not yet joined in 2018, but have indicated they intend to do so, almost in all cases people who have been members for a while and so I'm opting to trust them in counting their vote. There are also a few who will only rejoin if we remain SAL affiliated.

A common theme in responses was that people did not have a strong opinion but felt on balance that staying with SAL was the right option.

On the basis of the above vote no committee meeting was considered necessary and the club re-affiliated with SAL. This will hopefully put this discussion to bed for a while.

A couple of other points for thought:

• The requirements for a PVG checked welfare officer still exist with SAL - something we've not fulfilled the last couple of years. It does remain a requirement though.

• The way the Carnethy club is set-up has been discussed before and put forward as an option for the club with the two separate divisions. This would need additional impetus to both understand and canvas the club, not something I propose to do just now.

Clyde Williamson won the Hill of Fare and Pressendye races and will no doubt be winning more next year when he's eligible to run in them all! Clyde also won the inaugural Buck race, part of the Ben Abrahams triple.

# Mountain Marathons

A number of Cosmics attended the final ever LAMM on the beautiful Isle of Harris, including Colin Russell & Kevin Harper, Caroline Watt and Lynn Smith, Ian Hamilton and Colin Larmour, Elaine Stewart with Richard Wade.

At the GL3-Day were Gillian Clunas, Elaine Stewart and Linda Smith.

Another fantastic GMC was held in Braemar in November, with Gillian Clunas, Bob Elder and Richard Lang running from the club.

#### Other races

Alan Cormack had his usual busy year, with amongst these races:

- He started the spine (a race he has previously completed), and although he didn't manage it this year, he came back for the summer version and finished that in 15<sup>th</sup> place in 144 hours.
- He also didn't quite finish the Monarch's Way a mere 615 mile race. After doing 400 miles last year, he was a little less this year in 147 miles of running.
- He did manage to complete the T184 in 70 hours, finishing second, and the Highland fling and also the Escape from Meriden race (again), where he was chained to someone for the 24 hour duration.

Jonathan Bellarby came very close to finishing the winter spine, and would likely have had it not been for a painful ankle in the last 10 miles. Colin, Russell and Graeme Cumming also completed the 53 mile Highland Fling.

Linda completed the UTMB Oman race in 38 hours – finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> in her category.

Colin Russell ran the 4-day Monte Rosa ultra, finishing 10th overall.
